Argyll and Bute Council	Based in Rothesay on the Isle of Bute this project aims to redevelop the Grade A listed Rothesay Pavilion on the town's seafront into a centre for cultural, commercial and community use, to comprise a year round programme of exhibitions, a cafe/restaurant, retail, meeting and function space and office space for business lets. The project will carry out repairs to the roof; windows, stonework and architectural features, and the redevelopment of the building will create direct jobs for local people and support the island economy by boosting visitor numbers.	£600,000
Barra & Vatersay Community Ltd	To install a set of pontoons in Castlebay Harbour for the use of the local water sports clubs, local residents and visiting yachtsmen to improve access to marine pursuits and increase the safety of water sports participants. The project will directly benefit the existing water sports clubs and yachtsmen and will indirectly benefit the local shops, hotels and cafes by encouraging more visitors to the island due to the increased facilities available.	£906,781
