Leaders with Lived Experience



What is a lived experience leader?

This is someone who uses their own experience to help change or make things better for other people.



For example, someone who has a learning difficulty may set up a group to support other people with learning difficulties.

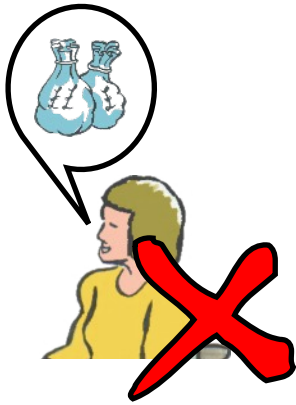


What is the Leaders with Lived Experience Programme?

This is money given out by the Community Fund for groups run by people with Lived Experience who want to help others.



The money comes from people who play the National Lottery.



There is only a small amount of money so not everyone will who asks for money will get some.



The person asking for the money must have a **lived experience** of the people they want to help.



The money must be used to help other people.

You can ask for funding between £20,000 and £50,000.

Who can ask for money?

To ask for money you must tick all of these boxes:



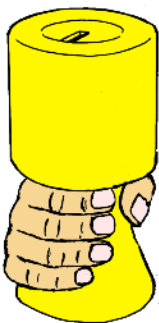
- the work you do has to be in the UK



- a voluntary or community group

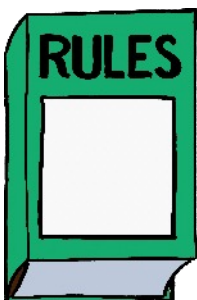


- a group run by someone who has lived experience.



The group must also be one of these:

- a registered charity



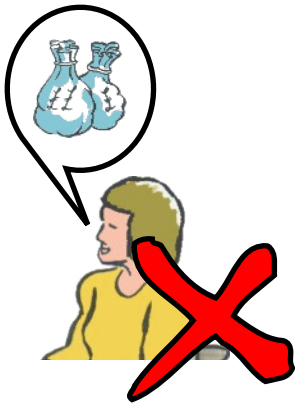
- a group or club with proper rules on how they run



- a not-for-profit company



- a social enterprise.

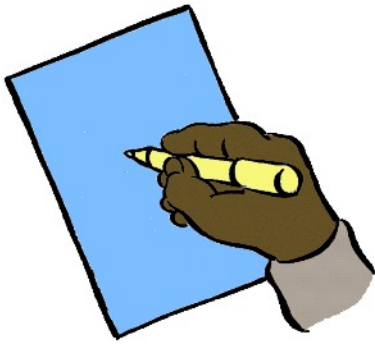


You cannot ask for money if you are not one of these things.



How to ask?

To ask for money you must explain why you need it.



You can do this:

- in writing



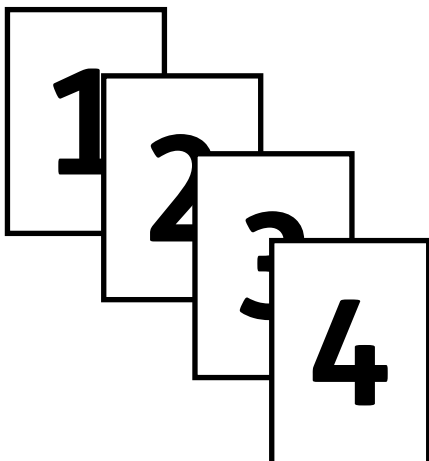
- in a video.

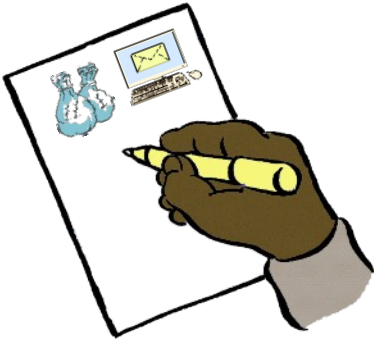
In writing

You can send your budget and contact details in writing.

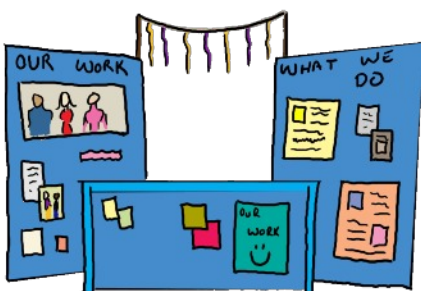


What you can spend the money on

- equipment



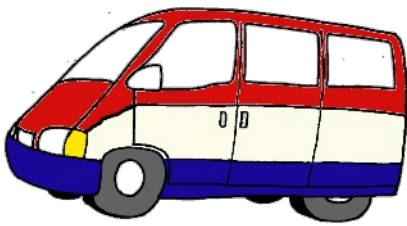
- events

- things that the government already pay for, like doctors



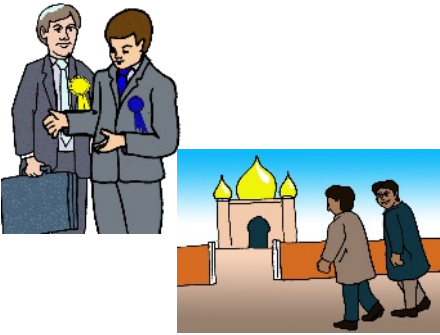
- unexpected costs or loans



- making electricity



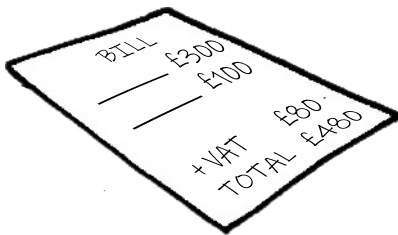
- paying someone to write this form

- building costs.

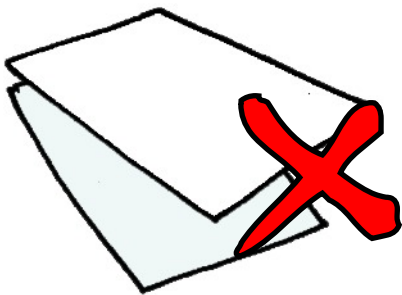
What happens next?



We will have a look at all the applications. The best ones will go to the next stage, called stage 2.

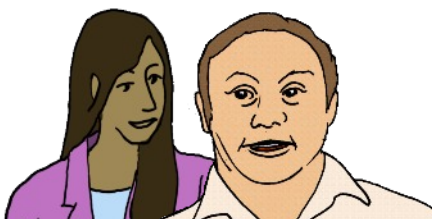


If you go through stage 2 we will get in touch to find out more information.



Information we will need at stage 2

You do not need to send this information now.



To be able to have money from The National Lottery Community Fund we need some more information about 2 people from your group or organisation.



The 2 people must not be:

- related



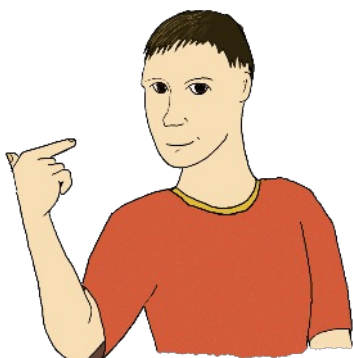
- married



- in a relationship



- live together.



Information we will need about these people:

- names



- address or phone number or email



- date of birth

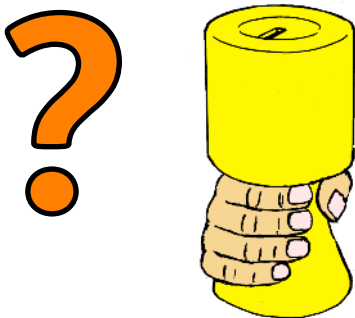


- The organisations:

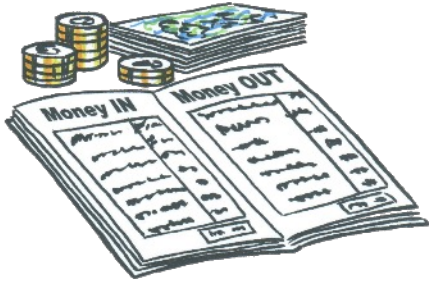


- the type of organisation - For example a charity.

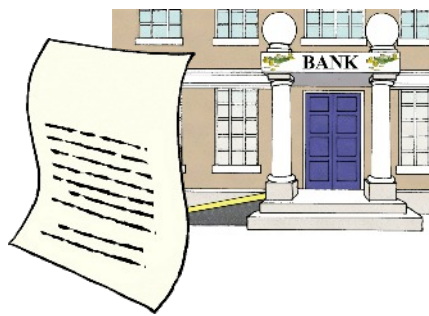


You will also need to show us a copy of:

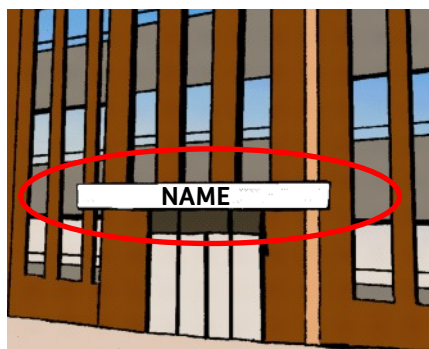
- your bank accounts



- the total amounts you have coming in each year.



If you get through to stage 2 we will also need a letter from your organisations bank.



This must say:

- the Organisations legal name



- address

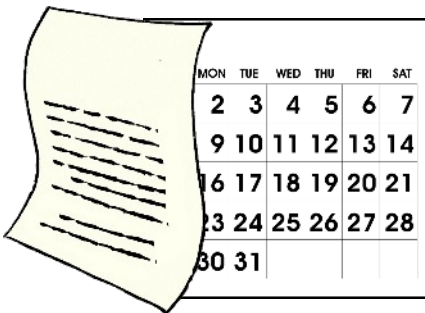


- bank name
