YMCA Scotland	City of Edinburgh	£237,216	This group will provide a community based mentoring programme for at-risk young people aged eight to 14 in Glasgow, Edinburgh, Midlothian, Dundee and Perth. Adult mentors will work with young people, engaging them in activities and opportunities to address issues such as disruption or disengagement at school, offending or antisocial behaviour.
Visibility	Dumfries and Galloway	£123,993	This group will use the funding to establish local community support hubs and continue delivering their home visit and peer support service for adults living with sensory loss in Dumfries & Galloway. The project aims to bring those with sensory loss together to share experiences, increase their knowledge about services available to them and enable them to better manage their sensory impairment.
Multiple Sclerosis Society	Dundee City	£132,773	This group will use the funding to pilot a programme of support for people with Multiple Sclerosis in Dundee, Angus and Perth and Kinross. The programme will focus on people who have been newly diagnosed, and will include one to one counselling, group sessions and peer support.
Centrestage Communities Ltd	East Ayrshire	£66,971	This group will continue to develop and deliver its activities in Shortlees where children and families are experiencing food insecurity. It will use music and food to bring people together to catalyse the energy of the community, whilst redistributing surplus food and maintaining individual dignity.
Council of Voluntary Organisations (East Ayrshire) Limited	East Ayrshire	£41,181	This organisation will use the funding to continue to deliver a range of community activities including coffee mornings, community foras and get-togethers. It will also support other groups using the hub to deliver a range of other activities including craft groups, fun days and outings.
Our Wee Place - Shortlees Clans	East Ayrshire	£15,000	This group will design and deliver a range of craft activities and community events. Activities will include arts and crafts, sewing and baking. It will also organise community outings and events including Halloween and Christmas celebrations.

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Glasgow's Golden Generation	Glasgow City	£99,000	This group will use the funding to strengthen their volunteer network which supports the delivery of services to reduce isolation and loneliness amongst older people living in Glasgow. Services include over seventy weekly social clubs, three Day Care Centres, and Befriending and Welfare Income Maximisation Support. The project will employ an Engagement Volunteer Manager and Volunteer Co-ordinator to run the dedicated Volunteer Support Service.
Revive MS Support	Glasgow City	£98,819	This group will use the funding to improve their outreach work to benefit the most isolated and unsupported sufferers of Multiple Sclerosis (MS). The group will also implement the Access to Revive MS Support programme, which is a remote consultation service that they have recently piloted.
The Urban Roots Initiative	Glasgow City	£118,427	This group will use the funding to deliver community activities for people living in Toryglen in the southside of Glasgow which will help to reduce social isolation, strengthen community connections, create opportunities for learning new skills and improve health and wellbeing. Activities will include new community growing spaces, continued development across the existing community gardens and a programme of volunteering opportunities which will run throughout the year.
Whiteinch Centre Ltd	Glasgow City	£118,000	This group will use the funding to run the community-owned Whiteinch Centre delivering a range of activities and services including a volunteer programme, social inclusion clubs and a varied programme of health and wellbeing activities.
Beith Trust	North Ayrshire	£526,410	This group will use the funding to complete the final phase of refurbishment to the former sports hall on the fifteen acre Geilsland estate. The renovation works will include the installation of new entrance facility and provide access to the first floor through the installation of a lift. The development will provide local jobs, and volunteering and training opportunities.
Bipolar Scotland	Renfrewshire	£91,050	This two year project will be used to deliver the groups self-management training to individuals across Scotland. The self-management training will be complemented by peer support self-help groups that have been established across the country to support people with bipolar disorder.
Stable Life	Scottish Borders	£120,000	This group will use the funding to provide Equine Assisted Learning (EAL) to children and young people aged 10 to 18 with a range of social, emotional and behavioural issues. The programme aims to improve confidence and self-esteem, help children develop social skills and manage problematic behaviour.

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The Carrick Centre	South Ayrshire	£104,485	This funding will be used to maintain and develop the community hub which provides a wide array of activities, support and opportunities to benefit the health and well-being of the residents of Maybole and the surrounding villages. The Centre will house and support over 40 diverse local community groups.
Burnhill Action Group	South Lanarkshire	£78,380	This group will use the funding to continue delivery and to further develop their community engagement and activity programme in the Burnhill area of Rutherglen. The programme will engage people of all ages through weekly hubs delivering community-led family/youth activities, health/wellbeing sessions, financial/employability advice, awareness raising workshops and community wide events.
Kirknewton Community Development Trust Ltd	West Lothian	£75,000	This group will use the funding to support a range of activities reflecting the results of their current (and future) community consultations. Activities will include recruiting and supporting volunteers, growing the youth club, addressing young people's mental health, and supporting services for older people such as mobile chiropody.
