Organisation	Local Authority	Award	Project summary
The Community Bureau	Argyll and Bute	£30,000	This funding will enable the organisation to sustain and develop a programme of community activities including a community volunteer programme, running a small volunteer led shop and a programme of workshops and information sessions.
Fast Forward (Positive Lifestyles) Limited	City of Edinburgh	£76,415	This group will deliver educational parenting workshops for vulnerable and at-risk dads, grandads and male carers/guardians. Activities will include group workshops and one-to-one sessions where themes such as adolescence, risk taking behaviour in children and young people and navigating difficult conversations will be covered.
Move On	City of Edinburgh	£146,036	This group will provide mentoring to disadvantaged young people aged between 14-24 years of age in Edinburgh. The project will help young people to gain skills and develop resilience to meet life challenges.
Clackmannanshire Women's Aid SCIO	Clackmannanshire	£65,922	This group will provide a new independent advocacy service which for women living in Clackmannanshire who are victims of domestic abuse. The project will give a voice to survivors and provide them with the necessary support to begin a new life away from their abuser.
Paths for All Partnership	Clackmannanshire	£59,524	This group will support local walking groups, organisations and individuals across Perth and Kinross, South Ayrshire, North Ayrshire and East Ayrshire to develop dementia friendly walking. Over two years 450 people will take part in activities and the project will be supported by 60 volunteers.
Dumfries & Galloway Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Plus	Dumfries and Galloway	£120,000	This group will continue and develop their activities across D&G. LGBTQI adults and their families, carers, and supporters will be supported helping to reduce isolation and improve well-being through a range of activities aimed at increase social connections.
Hollies Day Centre	East Lothian	£120,000	This group will provide a range of activities for people aged over 60 including a daily lunch club, exercise classes and intergenerational activities with children from local primary schools. The project will reduce isolation and loneliness by improving opportunities for social interaction, and helping to improve physical and mental wellbeing through activities.

Barrhead Men's Shed SCIO	East Renfrewshire	£49,150	This group will use the funding to support their work for the next three years and will build capacity to meet demand allow ing them to reach out to more people in the community to meet demand.
Central Scotland Green Network Trust	Falkirk	£58,000	This project will deliver the first phase of the wider regeneration of Easter Carmuir's Park in Camelon. The group will carry out a range improvements to the park which will improve accessibility, appearance and biodiversity and open up the space for more people in the community to enjoy.
Options in Life	Fife	£90,000	This group expand their social inclusion and skills development programme for young adults with learning disabilities. Young people will develop skills and take part in social activities once they leave full-time education helping them to more fully integrate with mainstream society.
Thenue Communities	Glasgow City	£100,000	This group will build on their existing 'Calton Green Volunteers' project to include a range of community activities focusing on improving the environment, increasing levels of social capital and enhancing the overall well-being of local people.
Unity Enterprise	Glasgow City	£150,000	This group will develop two new strands of work in Glasgow a training kitchen for adults and young people with learning disabilities, and a social kitchen and dining experience for isolated and vulnerable people.
Loanhead After School Club and Community Nursery	Midlothian	£136,882	This group will build on their weekly programme of activities for residents of Loanhead. Current community led groups running from the centre include parent and toddler groups, kraft groups and lunch clubs. By employing a community links worker the centre will be able existing groups, upskill volunteers and create new groups based on feedback from the community.
Barrmill and District Community Association	North Ayrshire	£91,458	This group will employ a Development Worker to complement their existing community events and build on their legacy project led by a now retired District Ranger. They will also develop their community woodland to create an outdoor community environment which will allow people to enjoy the physical, mental and social benefits of outdoor activities.
Abundant Borders	Scottish Borders	£104,278	This project will build on previously established gardens in Eyemouth, Ayton and Hawick. Groups of up to 15 people will volunteer at each garden and will learn new skills to be able to produce and cook healthy and inexpensive food.
Lightburn Elderly Association Project Limited	South Lanarkshire	£47,140	This group continue to run a leisure and learning service which offers a wide range of classes to people aged 50 plus across South Lanarkshire. An Adult and Education Co-ordinator will develop the programme of health and wellbeing activities to build networks and friendships and reduce feelings of isolation and loneliness for local older people.
