Libertus Services	City of Edinburgh	£125,888	This group will be able to expand their Positive Futures service currently delivered in South Central and South East of Edinburgh into the North West of the city. The service provides a range of activity groups for over 50s facilitated by local volunteers which take place in community-based settings. The project will work with around 450 people and involve 40 volunteers over the next three years.
Multi-Cultural Family Base	City of Edinburgh	£143,465	This group will use the funding to deliver the Bright Choices project which safeguards women, children, men and families from BAME communities who are at risk of or are experiencing coercive control, honour based violence or female genital mutilation. The project will take a rights and choice based approach using a combination of home visits, one-to-one support, group work, and peer support/mentoring, working with over 200 people over three years.
Siblings Reunited (STAR) (SCIO)	Fife	£60,000	This group will provide volunteer supervised contact for siblings separated through foster care, residential care, adoption or kinship care. This service runs from their base in North East Fife where the young people will be able to develop meaningful relationships with their siblings in a natural, safe, supported and fun environment. Over the next three years, 650 young people will benefit, supported by 65 volunteers.
Cranhill Arts Project	Glasgow City	£88,329	This group will use the funding to continue to deliver their programme of arts and crafts workshops for people with disabilities and people with mental health issues. The group will deliver four workshops a week across three different sites in the North East and will hold an annual exhibition of all the work which has been produced.
Lochaber Hope	Highland	£98,000	This group will use the funding to develop a workshop-based project which will engage young men, who may at risk of suicide and/or social isolation, in the building a skiff therapy boat. The group will also run weekly practical skills groups, social workshop sessions with the wider community and will also set up a suicide prevention programme and support groups for families affected by suicide.
Friendly Access (SCIO)	Moray	£100,000	This group will use the funding to expand delivery of their adaptive surf and swim group sessions for young people with hidden and/or physical disabilities. Over the next two years the project will work with over 160 young people who will be supported by 30 volunteers.
Perth & Kinross Duke Of Edinburgh's Award Association	Perth and Kinross	£70,000	This group will use funding to deliver a programme of outdoor activities focused on improving the wellbeing of vulnerable young people who have disengaged with school or employment. Through a combination of one to one support and group activities the group will help young people gain new skills, experiences, awards and accreditations.

Our Place Our Families (Renfrew)	Renfrewshire	£119,825	This group will deliver a twice weekly community café serving a range of hot and cold food. The café has been operating on a pilot basis from the Arkleston Community Centre, a venue that is run by volunteers and has appropriate facilities.
The Bellsmyre Digital Community	West Dunbartonshire	£75,600	This group will use the funding to expand and develop their existing range of digital support sessions to the wider community. The group currently provides classes, clubs and certificated courses that supports continued and lifelong learning, promoting community cohesion through digital inclusion. This three year grant will work with 280 local people (including children and young people), and will be supported by 25 volunteers.
