Organisation	Local Authority	Award	Project summary
Shopper-Aide Ltd	Argyll and Bute	£115,942	This group will continue to run their existing services and activities for older people in the Kintyre Peninsula helping to reduce the isolation and loneliness faced by people aged 60 years and over in this remote area. Working with around 600 people the group will provide a shopping service, a housekeeping service, a prescription collection service, an individual and group befriending service and a variety of social clubs and activities. They will also provide volunteering opportunities for 100 people.
Edinburgh City Youth Cafe	City of Edinburgh	£195,155	The group will be able to develop their project which offers support to young people who have been victims of crime. Young people can self-refer to the service with activities and outcomes decided by the young people themselves. The group will be able to expand the age range of the young people they work with and extend their service into Midlothian. Over three years 225 young people will benefit with 10 volunteers supporting.
get2gether	City of Edinburgh	£145,000	This group will use the funding to continue to deliver a range of social events in safe venues for adults with disabilities to help ensure they live full adult lives. Four events will be offered each week including at least one at low or no cost. A quarter of the events will be led by Ambassadors who have lived experience of a disability and the programme will be delivered to 800 people and involve 50 volunteers.
Hibernian Community Foundation	City of Edinburgh	£148,500	This group will use the funding to deliver a three year programme aimed at reducing social isolation in Edinburgh among older people. The programme will include drop-in sessions, themed workshops, a holiday club, volunteering opportunities and mentoring activities. The project will work with 384 people and involve 48 volunteers.
The Welcoming Association	City of Edinburgh	£118,939	This group will use the funding to continue to run and develop their befriending programme for newly-arrived refugees who are resettling in Edinburgh. The programme will include one-to-one befriending, and weekly group conversation sessions where newcomers and local volunteers will have the opportunity to meet. The grant will also allow the group to run and expand its newly set up women's cafe for local women from socially deprived areas of Edinburgh.
CTSI	Clackmannanshire	£50,000	This group will provide a dedicated resource to support five volunteer led organisations in Clackmannanshire with their journey through the asset transfer process where they take ownership of community hall facilities from the local authority. The project will benefit 800 people with 60 volunteers providing support and a new post of Development Worker will deliver the project over the course of the next two years.

Lochside Community Association SCIO	Dumfries and Galloway	£50,032	This group will use the funding to carry out work to Lochside Community Centre enabling local people to access an improved community facility which provides a range of activities and events. Over one year it is estimated the improved facilities will benefit 1,000 local people and provide 25 volunteering opportunities.
Deaf Links	Dundee City	£147,327	This group will establish and deliver a 'sensory citizen advocacy' programme to support and empower deaf and sensory impaired people across the Tayside area. They will be able to create a bank of citizen advocates who will support local people to take more control of their own lives, growing their social confidence and personal resilience. This project will benefit 36 people and involve an equal number of volunteers.
Douglas Community Centre Local Managment Group	Dundee City	£40,018	This group will reinstate the Live N Kicking newsletter for the Douglas area of Dundee which will be delivered to over 3000 households in the Douglas community. This newsletter will inform local people about what's happening in the area and encourage them to get involved.
Taymara	Dundee City	£74,837	This group will help vulnerable children and their families to make positive changes in their lives through experience of life training. Taymara supports young people aged between 5-18 years of age who are currently experiencing the effects of severe ill health and the programme is designed to help relieve the stress that surrounds those who are or have been ill and those most closely affected.
Galston Community Development Trust	East Ayrshire	£95,594	This group will use the funding to employ a community development officer to help to implement their action plan to develop and implement a range of new initiatives; some of which will be delivered within its community facility, The Portland.
International Women's Group	Glasgow City	£94,930	This group will use the funding to run a range of activities to improve the wellbeing and skills of minority ethnic women in Glasgow. Activities will include sewing classes, dance classes, cultural events, counselling and financial literacy workhshops. This three-year project will benefit 180 women and involve 30 volunteers.
North Glasgow Community Food Initiative	Glasgow City	£134,632	This group will deliver a range of community activities to people living in Milton to help reduce social isolation, strengthen community connections and create opportunities for learning new skills. Activities will include gardening, cooking, community meals, a fruit and vegetable barra, a community café, and community events. Over three years the project will reach over 1300 people and involve more than 60 volunteers.
The Prince's Trust	Glasgow City	£371,361	This group will adapt their access courses for marginalised young people aged between 13–25 years of age who have mental health issues. The programme will combine group activities, outdoor learning, one-to-one support and counselling to help give young people with mild to moderate mental health issues the support and life skills they need.
Tykes	Highland	£318,629	This group will continue to provide support services for young people with caring responsibilities in Sutherland. The group will deliver drop-in sessions, one to one support, group work and respite holiday breaks and activities. The group will also help young carers and their families access services and help to raise awareness of young carers' issues to schools, health workers and other professionals.

Home-Start Glasgow North	North Lanarkshire	£98,947	This group will use this three year award to continue to deliver and expand upon their family support service which deliver practical and emotional support to families with young children who facechallenging circumstances in Bellshill. Through a coordinated programme of activities, one to one support and perinatal mental health support, the organisation will work to help strengthen the relationship between parent and child.
Lanarkshire Deaf Club SCIO	North Lanarkshire	£120,000	This group will use the funding to continue to deliver a range of social activities and services to the Deaf community. They are designed to help people overcome social isolation and allow individuals to reach their potential by helping to reduce barriers to services and socialising. The activities invovled include a drop-in service, family and youth groups, a job club, and driving theory classes which will benefit around 600 people.
Perth Autism Support SCIO	Perth and Kinross	£114,102	This group will support young people aged 14 years and over who are on the autism spectrum, helping them navigate the transitional period between adolescence and adulthood. Through one to one support and targeted group work young people will be supported to understand their autism, improve their emotional regulation skills and develop practical skills.
Remake Scotland	Perth and Kinross	£148,978	This group will use the funding to develop a community resilience and resource programme which focuses on reuse, repair and enterprise. The group will develop easier donation points, creative reuse products, repair cafes, a gardening/greenspace programme, a whitegoods reuse programme and a tool borrowing library.
Shetland Women's Aid	Shetland Islands	£280,716	This group will support their clients by providing a three stage Trauma Recovery programme to successfully help to break cycles of abuse across their adult, children and young people's service. The five year project will provide one to one therapy, group sessions, a refuge when needed and will encourage clients to access local services and re-engage with their local community when ready.
Ayrshire Hospice	South Ayrshire	£351,424	This group will continue to run their service which provides a range of support across Ayrshire for people with a life limiting illness who want to die at home and their carers. The service will also provide additional support in times of increased need such as a crisis or rapidly changing health.
South Ayrshire Women's Aid	South Ayrshire	£118,302	This group will employ a specialist support worker to deliver flexible person centred support to women whose mental health has suffered as a consequence of domestic abuse. In addition the new support worker will deliver a range of practical assistance to women suffering from domestic abuse including helping them to access safe accommodation, obtain legal support, and help apply for housing and benefits. They will support 200 people and 10 volunteers over three years.
Community Links (South Lanarkshire)	South Lanarkshire	£32,760	This group will be able to retain their Community Development Worker, responsible for managing established relationships within the communities of Fairhill, Burnbank and Udston. They will also continue to support the community by building local capacity and making current community led services more sustainable by supporting the development of current volunteers and working to recruit new ones.

Larkhall and District Volunteer Group	South Lanarkshire	£150,000	This group will continue to deliver its current range of activities which include IT classes, a dementia group and community transport. The activities are designed to help local people take control of their lives, reduce isolation and improve wellbeing. The two year grant will be benefit approximately 400 people and involve 60 regular volunteers.
Project 31 SCIO	South Lanarkshire	£90,000	This group will deliver a range of early years activities to families within the Camglen area. The activities will centre around arts, sports, leisure, outdoor learning, play and literacy. They will engage with local families who would not otherwise have access due to social, economic or personal barriers. A Senior Project Worker will lead on delivery of activities as well as providing direct family support as and when needed.
REACH Lanarkshire Autism	South Lanarkshire	£146,704	This group will continue to deliver their core family support service providing ongoing help, training and advice to the parents/carers of young people with an Autism Spectrum Condition. The service empowers and builds connections amongst parent/carers who often feel isolated and unsupported following diagnosis. The project will benefit 250 people across Lanarkshire supported by 25 volunteers.
Talk Now	South Lanarkshire	£90,000	This group will use the funding to sustain their support service for adult survivors of childhood sexual abuse (CSA). The East Kilbride service also provides access to specialised counselling for men, women and family members of survivors as well as signposting and training for partner agencies. The support provided is designed to improve the health and wellbeing, develop sustainable support networks, and increase access to support services.
Stirling Carers Centre	Stirling	£184,553	This group will be able to provide individualised support to more local unpaid adult carers whose initial needs have been assessed as low to moderate. The project helps to reduce isolation, improve mental health outcomes and takes a preventative approach to prevent each individual's circumstances from reaching crisis point.
1st Step Development Ventures	West Lothian	£137,934	This group will use the funding to develop and continue to deliver their bike refurbishment programme for people in recovery from addiction. The support will help to build resilience by enhancing social skills, improving motivation, and providing new skills and qualifications.
