| Organisation | Local Authority | Award | Project summary |

| North East Sensory Services | Aberdeen City | £232,323 | This group will continue to deliver their Connect, Include and Support (CIS) project for the next two years. This work reduces isolation amongst older people with significant sight and hearing loss across Aberdeen and Moray. The group will run a range of social activities and practical support to assist with personal affairs and help them to remain as independent as possible. |
| Rainbow Rogues | Aberdeenshire | £48,373 | This group will use the funding to continue to deliver its dedicated playgroup sessions to families from across central Aberdeenshire who have a child under five years of age who have a disability or additional support needs. The group will run two sessions per week providing an opportunity for each child to learn and develop at their own rate while parents are supported to improve the wellbeing of the whole family. |
| Food Train | Dumfries and Galloway | £196,708 | This group will use the funding to continue their existing befriending service in Dumfries and Galloway and allow them to expand into West Lothian with an established presence through the grocery delivery service. Activities will include telephone contact, one to one home visits, community activities and group outings. The group will support 280 older people and 140 volunteers across Dumfries and Galloway and West Lothian. |
| Lincluden Community Centre Management Committee | Dumfries and Galloway | £376,240 | This group will use the funding to redevelop a local green space in Lincluden for the benefit of the local community in Lochside and Lincluden. The park will be used for events developed by Creative Futures, and Let's Get Lochside and Lincluden Sporty and it's estimated that over 3,200 local people will use the park. |
| Parents Inclusion Network | Dumfries and Galloway | £120,000 | This group will use the funding to continue delivering support, advice and activities across Dumfries & Galloway to families who have a child with a disability. The project will bring families who are experiencing the same issues together through a range of support from peer support groups, training and social outings. Over three years 1,500 people will take part in activities and the project will be supported by 10 volunteers. |

| Parent to Parent Ltd | Dundee City | £231,201 | This group will use the funding to deliver its 'FAB Together' project which will increase the number of support groups for parents/carers with young children with challenging behaviour. The activities will include one to one support for parents and carers, workshops for the families and peer-support groups. |
| St Ninian's Stay and Play Family Support | Dundee City | £99,260 | This group will use the funding to develop its weekly sessions in Dundee for another three years. This will be achieved by providing continuous support for parents, strengthening relationships with external services and developing a range of activities within the group. This project will benefit 222 people and involve 39 volunteers. |
| Auchinleck Community Development Initiative | East Ayrshire | £133,801 | This group will use the funding to engage with isolated, lonely and disengaged residents of Auchinleck to encourage them to take part in community activities. It's expected that 270 people and 30 volunteers will participate in activities over three years. |
| Twechar Community Action | East Dunbartonshire | £148,761 | This group will deliver a three year project for the whole community. Activities will be held within the Twechar Healthy Living and Enterprise Centre as well as some of its surrounding community gardens. |
| Central Advocacy Partners | Falkirk | £115,112 | This group delivers a range of advocacy and support services to people with learning disabilities across the Forth Valley area. They also deliver a dedicated advocacy and peer support project to parents with learning disabilities or learning difficulties whose families have had involvement from child protection services. The funding will allow the group to continue to offer emotional and practical support for parents through all stages of the protection process. |
| Collydean Community Centre | Fife | £122,805 | This group will use part of the funding to employ a centre manager who will be responsible for maximising community use of the Centre by local people and community groups. They will also be able to improve access by installing external ramps and an internal platform lift. |
| Kirkcaldy YMCA | Fife | £500,000 | This organisation will redevelop and extend the former bowling club in Gallatown Park, Kirkcaldy to provide a multi-use community hub for local residents and community groups. Services will include mother and toddlers groups, youth clubs, and a DIY and up-cycling project. |
| Saje Scotland Limited | Fife | £171,905 | This group will use the funding to continue to deliver the various programmes it runs and to develop their work supporting women who have experienced different forms of abuse. |
| Barmulloch Community Development Company Ltd | Glasgow City | £135,495 | This group run three community owned premises where they deliver a range of social, health and wellbeing, youth development, employment, and training activities for the community. The funding will help to support the growth and development of the organisation allowing them to increase the number of services they deliver. |

| Early Years Scotland | Glasgow City | £317,084 | This group will use the funding to support families with children aged five years and younger where a parent is in prison. Activities will include an educational programme for fathers, facilitated family visits and pre-visit sessions to help families feel more relaxed about their surroundings. The three-year project will help parents build knowledge and confidence and create a positive environment for families to bond. |
| Richmond's Hope | Glasgow City | £122,771 | This group will use funding to deliver Therapeutic Play based support for young people aged 4 to 18 years old who have been bereaved. Support will be open to people living in Glasgow and in the West of Scotland where specially trained volunteers will support young people and adults through Family Support Sessions, memorial events and Away Days. |
| The Scottish Huntingtons Association | Glasgow City | £249,708 | This group will use the funding to continue their youth project supporting young people aged 8 to 25 years, who have a diagnosis of Huntington's disease in their family. Young people will receive support through a range of interventions including 1:1 support, advice and information about living with HD, peer support through group work, residential camps and social activities. The two year project will support 110 young people and their parents/carers. |
| Woodlands Community Development Trust | Glasgow City | £130,871 | This group will use the funding to continue providing opportunities for local people to get involved in an array of community activities and workshops in Woodlands, Glasgow. The project will be delivered from Woodland Community Garden/Café/Workspace and over the next three years they will recruit, support and train a group of local volunteers. |
| Ecologia Youth Trust | Highland | £135,000 | This project will use the funding to empower 664 disadvantaged young people in the Highlands to build resilience, recognise their potential and take control of their lives. This 18 week mentoring programme will be delivered in 17 schools across the region. |
| Headway Highland | Highland | £80,796 | This group will use the funding to continue providing group support meetings for people with an Acquired Brain Injury (ABI) as well as their carers and family members. Group support meetings will take place in Inverness, Fort William, Nairn, Wick, Thurso, Dornoch and another group will be established in Oban. This project will also provide an accredited counselling service, group trips, activities, and give people the opportunity to socialise and engage with other services. |
| Moray Reach Out | Moray | £123,253 | This community led project will use the funding to move into a new premises in central Buckie and to refurbishing the building. They will also engage a Training and Support worker to work with members of the local community with particular focus on people with poor mental health, learning disabilities and those experiencing isolation or loneliness. |

| Three Towns Growers | North Ayrshire | £367,043 | This group will use the funding to improve range of facilities this group provides meaning that more local people can benefit from the work they do. Improvements will include expanding the number of growing areas, improving access to the site and providing a new purpose built cabin that will be available for local community groups to use. |
| Perth Six Circle Project | Perth and Kinross | £257,121 | This group will use funding to deliver a project aimed at disadvantaged, vulnerable, lonely and isolated adults who have been affected by a range of challenging circumstances. A programme of activities will be developed in line with service user interests and current activities including cookery, gardening, photography, poetry and music groups. |
| Support, Help and Integration in Perthshire (SCIO) | Perth and Kinross | £121,579 | This group will use the funding to provide a programme of play and leisure activities to young people with Additional Support Needs. They will provide social and play opportunities in a supportive environment to help improve the quality of life for the children and young people and at youth clubs with a committed team of young volunteers. |
| Roar - Connections for Life Ltd | Renfrewshire | £131,622 | This three year project will deliver a 'Stay Mobile Stay Connected' service for older people throughout Renfrewshire. The service will include home visits, and 'reablement' support to build the person's mobility, confidence and motivation to get out and about. The group will also run a support and signposting service to help the older person ensure that their home is as safe as possible. |
| Bouncet Innovative Occupational TherapyCIC | Stirling | £130,231 | This group will use the funding to provide a programme of free therapeutic play sessions to children and adults with a range of physical and learning disabilities. Based in Stirling the project will benefit 300 people from across the Forth Valley area, with 20 volunteers providing support over 3 years. |
| Isaro Social Integration Network | West Dunbartonshire | £149,921 | This group will support people from BME communities living in Clydebank by providing a range of activities aimed at reducing isolation. By providing weekly information sessions, social and wellbeing activities, language sessions, outings, cooking, and multi-cultural events this funding will bring a range of people together from different backgrounds to connect with their local community. |
