The Polar Academy	Angus	£55,000	This project will engage young people aged 13-17 years who lack confidence and are experiencing other life challenges. The young people will undergo a 10-month training schedule culminating in an Arctic expedition to Greenland or adventuring in Scotland. On their return they will commit to telling their stories to local children and young people and act as role models to inspire them to achieve.
MacTaggart Community Cyber Cafe	Argyll and Bute	£70,500	This group will use the funding to deliver a range of employability, skills and wellbeing initiatives targeted at young people aged from 16-25 years on Islay. The project will engage young people from the island community in a holistic package of support that will reduce barriers to training and employment, and improve self-belief and build resilience.
Menstrie Community Action Group Ltd	Clackmannanshire	£20,321	The group will use the funding to deliver a programme of recreational activities aimed at young people aged between 10-18 years resident in Menstrie.
The LGS Community Trust	Dumfries and Galloway	£95,662	This group will use the funding to deliver an E-Sports focused programme of activities for young people in Dumfries and Galloway. They will engage young people in training and vocational experience to help them to gain new skills in the digital sector. The project will improve life skills, physical and mental wellbeing and enhance employment prospects.
Tayside Council On Alcohol	Dundee City	£60,580	This group will use the funding to continue to run activity and wellbeing groups for young people in Angus and Dundee affected by alcohol or at risk of misuse. The group hopes to reach 50 young people with challenging circumstances and who are at risk of falling into anti-social behaviour.
We Are With You	East Dunbartonshire	£50,000	This group will launch a young people's support service that uses a holistic approach to help young people overcome substance misuse issues.
Glasgow Girls FC	Glasgow City	£70,553	This group will use the funding to continue and further develop a peer led mentoring project, including training for young mentors and volunteers, for girls aged between 8-24 years of age from the east end of Glasgow.
Sound Lab	Glasgow City	£48,400	This group will deliver music tuition and education for young people in Glasgow. The project will have three strands which will work with those with care experience, from migrant backgrounds and young people with disabilities.

The Children's Wood	Glasgow City	£100,000	This project will engage young people (aged between 10-25 years) in the G20 postcode and surrounding areas, who have been involved in antisocial behaviour.
The Village Storytelling Centre	Glasgow City	£99,714	This group will use the funding to deliver their Developing Young Storytellers programme, which will collaborate with young people aged between 8-24 years from Greater Pollok, Newlands and Auldburn in Glasgow. The project will support young people to share their voices on the things that matter to them, and enable them to become an active voice in their community.
theGKexperience SCIO	Glasgow City	£99,000	This project will support young people (aged between 8 -21 years) from across Glasgow to get a job or start a new business. They will do this through residential experiences, local group work, a young leaders programme, and one to one support.
Toonspeak Young People's Theatre	Glasgow City	£60,000	This group will use the funding to provide access to creative activities for young people of secondary school age in Glasgow.
Royal Airforce Benevolent Fund	Moray	£91,246	This project will engage children and young people, with one or both parents serving in the RAF, with activities including arts and crafts, cooking, and sports. Responding to the concerns of young people regarding their mental health, the project will also facilitate discussions around their fears and worries in relation to having one or more parent in the RAF.
Arran Youth Foundations	North Ayrshire	£76,950	This group will use the funding to offer a wide range of youth work activities and drop-in sessions to the young people of Arran, these will be chosen by the young people themselves and will include an LGBT+ club, a girls football team and lunch time drop in sessions. Young people will be supported to take the lead in running activities that they want and can access mental health and wellbeing support.
The New Tannahill Centre Limited	Renfrewshire	£58,727	This group will use funding to support young people through volunteering and active citizenship in Ferguslie Park. Young people will develop, design, and deliver a range of services and events that they have identified as being a priority for them. This will involve taking part in training and personal development opportunities including some accredited training or qualifications that will support future employability.
Clifftop Projects CIC	West Dunbartonshire	£77,881	This project will see the continuation of the existing Art Hub weekly creative sessions for primary school age children and the creation of new monthly youth creative evenings programme aimed at young people aged between 13-25 years of age. The project will also create a youth coordinator post designed specifically to help a local young person build relevant skills and experience so that they can pursue a career in the arts and creative industries.
