Brechin Community Football Trust	Angus	£90,200	The trust will deliver a three year project that will incorporate a range of youth work with three key themes wellbeing, community work, and accreditation. A new youth space will be developed to their deliver activities and hold community events with the aim of achieving a variety of accreditation such as Dynamic Youth and Saltire Awards.
Brechin Youth Project	Angus	£67,005	This organisation will continue its youth drop-in centre in Brechin, delivering a variety of activities for young people aged 12 to 24, as well as a providing an informal space to socialise. Through this, it will enable young people to build social connections, and learn new skills and interests.
Imagineate	City of Edinburgh	£74,695	This group will use the funding to expand on their 'Creative Encounters' pilot project in schools. Young people aged 8 to 12 will work with artists to co-create five performances and a child's rights manifesto culminating in a showcase event.
Let's Talk (Young People) CIC	City of Edinburgh	£100,000	This group will use funding to deliver their 'Feel Good' project aimed at supporting young people who have experienced developmental trauma or early adversity. Let's Talk activities will be delivered by trained mental health practitioners who work to build the resilience and mental wellbeing of the young people who attend.
Scotland Yard Adventure Centre	City of Edinburgh	£90,000	This group will use the funding for their Fun and Friendship Club for disabled young people. The club runs once a fortnight at their purpose built space in Edinburgh. These youth sessions cater for different ages, and allow the young people to come together in a safe space, make friends, explore new activities, and get the support they need to do this.
The Junction - Young People, Health & Wellbeing	City of Edinburgh	£96,091	This group will use the funding to review and develop their Junction Youth Advisor group. The JYA are made up from young people from the Leith and North East Edinburgh community aged 14 to 21, with on average eight young people in the group who get together every month to talk about the issues that impact the lives of young people in the community and explore how they can work together to make positive changes. They also volunteer and support The Junction to develop its services, whilst evolving their own understanding of health and wellbeing issues and promoting the work of the organisation.
Youth Vision	City of Edinburgh	£77,955	This organisation will use funding to continue delivery of their Young Leaders group who will mentor and lead younger participants in nature-based educational activities. The Young Leaders will actively contribute to the planning and execution of the organisation's outdoor learning initiatives. Additionally, they will engage in training sessions and skills courses, ultimately attaining qualifications that will equip them with valuable skills to pave the way towards positive future prospects.

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Kirkcudbright Development Trust	Dumfries and Galloway	£83,870	This group will use the funding to continue delivering their youth project providing young people in Kirkcudbright with safe opportunities to socialise with peers as well as support with issues which may be affecting them.
Dundee Crisis Pregnancy Trust	Dundee City	£98,000	The group will use the funding to redevelop their talking therapies service in order to provide more intervention and support for young people struggling with mental health issues.
The Speech Language Communication Company	Dundee City	£43,135	The group will use the funding to continue to run their youth club for children and young people with severe speech and communication difficulties. This will be active and engaging youth provision involving a wide range of activities, decided by the young people themselves. Activities often involve team building, skills development, social events as well as trips. The project will work with young people from across Dundee and Tayside.
Twechar Community Action	East Dunbartonshire	£66,261	This grant will support the continuation of Twechar Youth Initiative a young person led all year round programme of many forms of activity created for and by young people aged 8 to 21. Junior and senior classes will run after school during term time and in school holidays, and there will always be activities on for both junior and senior aged young people with activity only paused over Christmas.
Barrhead Housing Association Limited	East Renfrewshire	£98,982	This group will use the funding to set up a youth board in order to consult young people on BHA activities and decisions, deliver high-school classes on how to maintain a tenancy and live independently, and to employ a project officer to support young tenants (24 years of age and under) with difficulties related to tenancy maintenance and independent living.
Go Youth Trust	Falkirk	£97,509	The group will support young people aged 10 to 25 from across Falkirk in building their confidence and skills through free year round drop-in sessions. The youth work team will work with 300 young people and 20 volunteers over three years.
Methilhill Community Children's Initiative Ltd	Fife	£90,985	The group will use the funding to provide youth work and volunteering activity for children 8+ years of age. This will help disadvantaged young people better prepare for the future through activities where they gain new skills and experiences.
Community Renewal Trust	Glasgow City	£98,149	This group will use the funding to deliver their youth development project that will work specifically with young people from the Roma community in Govanhill. The project will support these young people to gain practical experience and empower them to build on their strengths, develop ideas, and connect with local organisations to enhance their opportunities.
Glasgow and Clyde Rape Crisis	Glasgow City	£100,000	This group will use the funding to deliver the 'Fair Play' programme that focuses on preventing, through training and skill building with young people, gender-based violence in sport. The project will be delivered by the specialist in house 'Rosey' project to provide support sessions and workshops challenging discriminatory attitudes/behaviours and reducing the acceptance of sexual and gender-based violence in sport.

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Glasgow Girls FC	Glasgow City	£34,249	This group will use the funding to continue and further develop their peer led mentoring project, including training for young mentors and volunteers, as well as other activities that support the physical, mental and emotional wellbeing of young girls aged 8 to 24 from east end of Glasgow.
Gorbals Youth Cafe SCIO	Glasgow City	£78,903	This group will use the funding to develop and deliver their Youth Work trainee programme for young people aged 16 to 18 in the Gorbals who are not currently in employment or education. The project involves trainees in the development and implementation of youth work activities whilst developing their skills in youth work, leading to accreditation and further opportunities in the field.
Include Me 2 Club SCIO	Glasgow City	£77,259	This group will use the funding to continue and expand their programme of personal development and supported volunteering and work placements for young people in East Renfrewshire, Renfrewshire and Glasgow with Additional Support Needs (ASNs).
One Parent Families Scotland	Glasgow City	£89,842	The group will use the funding to continue to deliver their young parents project aimed at parents aged 16 to 24.
PEEK- Possibilities for Each and Every Kid Ltd	Glasgow City	£99,000	This group will use the funding to provide a multi-tiered creative arts programme for children and young people aged 8 to 18 across the north east of Glasgow.
Scottish Music Information Centre Ltd	Glasgow City	£100,000	This group will use the funding to deliver the only national music mentoring and tuition project designed for care experienced young people in Scotland. The group will use music as a therapeutic tool to raise the confidence and wellbeing of the young people they work with.
Somali Association in Glasgow	Glasgow City	£60,605	This group will use the funding to deliver a weekly programme of diversionary activities for children and young people from the Somali community and refugee/asylum seeking backgrounds. The project aims to improve wellbeing and access to social networks within the community by delivering football and activities in three community venues in the Southside of Glasgow.
The Citizens Theatre Ltd	Glasgow City	£83,539	This group will use the funding to continue their work that offers members aged 18 to 24 the chance to develop their skills in the world of theatre and performance with the aim of building confidence and offering young people a space to explore who they are. The project will be delivered in the Gorbals and will be moving back into the Citizen's Theatre in 2024 when the venue reopens.
The National Autistic Society	Glasgow City	£99,437	The group will use the funding to deliver the 'Empower Up programme ' to support a cohort of young autistic people to develop meaningful social connections outside formal education around Glasgow and surrounding areas. This will enable the young people to build their connections, social skills and independence.
The Pearce Institute	Glasgow City	£100,000	This group will use the funding to deliver a youth arts project to engage young people aged 10 to 16. They will look at issues around sectarianism, homophobia, transphobia, and religious intolerance.

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Eden Court Highlands	Highland	£77,222	This group will use the funding to deliver a new, youth-led creative project for young people aged 14 to 24 facing complex challenges in the Highland and Moray areas. The three year project will improve the mental health and wellbeing of 72 young people through weekly, professionally led creative sessions in areas such as filmmaking, sound design, photography and performing.
Mind Mosaic Child and Family Therapies	Inverclyde	£60,000	The organisation will use this funding to continue their Highway to Heroes activities (using super heroes' values to find the super hero within the young people they support, helping them better cope with their feelings), as well as a new peer support group for young people living through grief, loss and change.
Elutheria Company Ltd	North Lanarkshire	£98,835	This organisation will continue to deliver its inclusive youth programme to improve young people from Bargeddie in North Lanarkshire's confidence and social skills. The project will provide weekly activities for young people with opportunities and learning offered in STEM, IT, arts, sports, and healthy eating. There will also be a homework club and educational day trips during school holidays.
LANDED Peer Education Service	North Lanarkshire	£100,000	This programme will be aimed at young people aged 16 to 24 from vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds and those who are marginalised from society. The project will recruit, train and support vulnerable young people to become volunteer peer educators and mentors in the area on age relevant health education issues. The project aims to support young people to achieve qualitative changes that they can use in all aspects of their lives.
Kinross-shire Youth Enterprise (KYTHE) SCIO	Perth and Kinross	£90,000	This group will use the funding to continue to deliver their youth work project, supporting young people aged 11 to 19. The group will provide drop-ins, scheduled activities and workshops to help young people feel connected and supported.
Scottish Afro Caribbean Arts Association (SACAA)	Renfrewshire	£57,586	This group will use the funding to support children and young people from ethnic minority backgrounds to have increased access to music and dance, arts, and sports based activities. Based in Paisley, the project will work with 180 children and young people from across Renfrewshire over three years.
Works+	Scottish Borders	£78,812	This group will use the funding to continue helping unemployed young people in the Scottish Borders with access to training and skill development opportunities. This will enable them to secure work, return to education or access further training.
Moving on Employment Project	Shetland Islands	£65,065	This small independent charity based in Shetland supports individuals to achieve their employment related goals. They provide a confidential, asset-based approach to employability support and will develop the service to meet the growing demand for additional support in the community for young people.

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The Carrick Centre	South Ayrshire	£100,000	This group will use the funding to turn an unoccupied property in the centre of Maybole into a youth hub run by and for young people. The dedicated facility will provide a focal point for activity based on interests expressed by young people, with a particular emphasis on those aged 12 to 19, as well as a younger primary school-age group. The group will also support a Youth Board to play a meaningful role in the project's governance.
Radical Weavers Limited	Stirling	£96,720	The group will use the funding to deliver a peer led programme where young people resident in Stirling and Clackmannanshire will participate in clothing alteration workshops. The activity will provide practical skills, reduce isolation and be facilitated by a qualified Tutor.
Stirling Community Enterprise Limited	Stirling	£98,299	The group will use the funding to deliver a peer led programme aimed at young people resident in the Raploch area of Stirling who are not engaged in education, employment or training, and who are involved in anti social behaviour, or at risk of coming into contact with the criminal justice system. A Peer Mentor will undertake street outreach activity to guide individuals towards the group's range of employability courses and practical training opportunities.
Haldane Youth Services	West Dunbartonshire	£84,011	This group will use the funding to continue and develop an existing out-of-school and school holiday programme, for children and young people in and around Haldane, Balloch. The aim of the project is to support the wellbeing of children and young people in Haldane, to strengthen connections across their community, and to build skills and links to future education, employment and training opportunities.
Scottish Families Affected by Alcohol and Drugs	West Dunbartonshire	£99,997	This organisation will use the funding to pay for a Support Assistant that will lead groups and offer day-to-day support to young people using their Routes service, focused on supporting children and young people affected by someone else's alcohol and other drug use.
West Dunbartonshire Sports Youth Group	West Dunbartonshire	£53,462	The group will use this funding to provide activities for young people aged 14 to 21 in West Dunbartonshire, focusing on developing them into confident young leaders, volunteers and skilled sports coaches.
The Larder West Lothian	West Lothian	£94,132	This group will use the funding to continue the 'Realising Potential' project and create a 26-week training programme for young people with additional support needs. This will help participants to move into a positive destination of employment, volunteering or further education.
